
We then talked about some tips for writing critical notes: Who – What – Why – How


The youngsters divided themselves into groups, and decided on what topic or topics they want to discuss with the politicians. They were all engaged and reflected well.



Topic: Construction work on the local football field preventing them from playing for months




Topic: More engaging youth participation!

Topic: Availability of cheap and healthy fast food!





#### A summary of the activity:

The groups continued their work from last meeting at home and consequently, five groups sent emails to the politicians and one group held an oral presentation. The same youngsters from the last meeting were presented and participated alongside three politicians.

We began the meeting by an informal warm-up activity consisting of “this or that icebreaker dilemmas”. Thereafter the groups presented their topics: “*Compulsory psychology appointment during school hours*”, “*Absence limit for upper secondary schools*”, “*Construction work and delayed completion*”, “*Eating during lecture*” and “*Increasing youth participation within the local environment*”. The topics sparked proper and honest discussions and we obtained interesting insights from the perspectives of both the youth and the politicians.



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
